PROPOSED STATEMENT OF BASIS, PURPOSE AND SPECIFIC STATUTORY AUTHORITY FOR Amendments to:

DEPARTMENT OF PERSONNEL & ADMINISTRATION Office of the Executive Director PROCUREMENT ADMINISTRATIVE RULE

The Colorado Department of Personnel and Administration's administrative procurement rule is found at 1 CCR 109. A rulemaking was held on October 30, 2013 at 633 17th St., Suite 2ABC, Denver, Colorado 80202. The hearing was held in order to facilitate amendments/changes and updates to the rule pursuant to the passage of HB13-1292 – the "Keep Jobs in Colorado Act of 2013." The executive director is exercising her rulemaking authority as granted under 24-92-110, C.R.S., 24-102-101, C.R.S. and HB 13-1292.

The Notice of Proposed Rulemaking was issued September 30, 2013 for publication by the Secretary of State on October 10, 2013. The proposed rules and statement of basis and purpose have been available for review at the Executive Director's website since September 30, 2013. The Executive Director is taking testimony at the public rulemaking hearing on October 30, 2103. The Executive Director will complete deliberations on the proposed amendment on November 5, 2013. The rules will be accepted through formal public hearing and submitted to the Attorney General for approval.

Purpose

The general purpose of this procurement rule is to establish policies and procedures for the procurement of goods and/or services for State of Colorado agencies, institutions and other authorized organizations.



Reason for Proposed Changes

HB13-1292 - Concerning modifications to procurement requirements for government contracts related to United States domestic employment, also known as the "Keep Jobs in Colorado Act of 2013."
