1. Call to order

6. Strategic Plan Update

Staff provided an update on the next steps from the program strategic plan. The Department has been working over the last year on strategic planning. The first of several next steps to move forward with the plan will be:

- Mapping ecosystem actors-Staff described plans to undertake a formal process to map and document the actors in the ecosystem that are engaged—or could be engaged—to advance the use of public data.
- b. Business analysis tactics and actions-Staff described plans to undertake more formal business analysis to better understand how public data can help business decision makers. Board members provided input and ideas for how to conduct the business analysis, including:
 - Provide context when discussing public data with business decision makers (i.e.

 data to solve business problems.
 - Ask broadly what types of analysis businesses (especially small businesses) use to make decisions, which will allow you to extrapolate what parts of that pertain to public data.
 - Potential to engage a firm to conduct research project.
