STATEMENT OF INSUFFICIENCY

April 28, 2016

On April 4, 2016, Republican U.S. Senate candidate Ryan Frazier submitted 18,581 petition signatures to the Secretary of State. The candidate seeks nomination by petition to the June 28, 2016 primary election ballot. Under Colorado law, Mr. Frazier's petition must contain at least 1,500 valid signatures from each of Colorado's seven congressional districts, for a total of at least 10,500 valid signatures statewide.¹
