



STATEMENT OF SUFFICIENCY

April 20, 2018

On March 19, 2018, Democratic gubernatorial candidate Donna Lynne submitted 22,512 petition signatures to the Secretary of State. The candidate seeks nomination by petition to the June 26, 2018 Democratic primary election ballot. Under Colorado law, Ms. Lynne’s petition must contain at least 1,500 valid signatures from each of Colorado’s seven congressional districts, for a total of at least 10,500 valid signatures statewide.¹

¹ Under section 1-4-801(2)(c)(II), C.R.S., a major party gubernatorial candidate petition requires signatures from “at least one thousand five hundred eligible electors in each congressional district”
