



STATEMENT OF INSUFFICIENCY


On March 1, 2022, Dom Waters, Democratic candidate for United States House of Representatives, District 1, submitted 105 petition signatures to the Elections Division of the Secretary of State. The candidate seeks nomination by petition to the June 28, 2022 primary election ballot. Under Colorado law, Ms. Waters's petition must contain at least 1,500 valid signatures.¹

Petition Verification Summary:

Number of qualified signatures submitted	105
Number of valid signatures required	1,500

Because this submission failed to reach the minimum requirement of 1,500 lines, the Elections Division of the Secretary of State's Office has deemed the petition insufficient.²

¹ Under section 1-4-801(2)(a.5), C.R.S., a major party congressional candidate petition requires "the lesser of one thousand five hundred signers or signers equal to ten percent of the votes cast in the district at the contested or uncontested primary election for the political party's candidate for the office for which the petition is being circulated . . ."

² Under Secretary of State Election Rule 15.1.2(e), "if the number of lines submitted is less than the number of signatures required to access the ballot, the Secretary of State will issue a statement of insufficiency and will not review signer lines or apply duplicates to future candidate petition submissions for the same office."
