



**STATEMENT OF SUFFICIENCY**

April 5, 2022

On March 14, 2022, Republican gubernatorial candidate Heidi Ganahl submitted 24,432 petition signatures to the Elections Division of the Office of the Secretary of State. The candidate seeks nomination by petition to the June 28, 2022 primary election ballot. Under Colorado law, Ms. Ganahl's petition must contain at least 1,500 valid signatures from each of Colorado's eight congressional districts, for a total of at least 12,000 valid signatures statewide.<sup>1</sup>


