
On March 15, 2022, Don Coram, Republican candidate for United States House of Representatives, District 3, submitted 1,953 petition signatures to the Elections Division of the Secretary of State's office. The candidate seeks nomination by petition to the June 28, 2022 primary election ballot. Under Colorado law, Mr. Coram's petition must contain at least 1,500 valid signatures.¹

The Elections Division of the Secretary of State's office has determined that Mr. Coram submitted a sufficient number of valid signatures to qualify for placement on the 2022 Republican Party primary election ballot. ¹ Under section 1-4-801(2)(a.5), C.R.S., a major party congressional candidate petition requires "the lesser of one thousand five hundred signers or signers equal to ten percent of the votes cast in the district at the contested or uncontested primary election for the political party's candidate for the office for which the petition is being circulated . . ."
