STATEMENT OF SUFFICIENCY
Proposed Initiative 2023-2024 #50
“Voter Approval to Retain Additional Property Tax Revenue”

October 6, 2023

On September 8, 2023, the designated representatives of 2023-2024 Proposed Initiative #50 (“Voter Approval to Retain Additional Property Tax Revenue”) submitted 227,357 petition signatures to the Elections Division of the Secretary of State’s office. Because Proposed Initiative #50 proposes to change the Colorado constitution, the petition must contain signatures from each state senate district equal to two percent of the total registered electors from each respective district, in addition to meeting the 124,238 threshold.¹

¹Under Article V, Section 1 (2.5) of the Colorado constitution, “a petition for an initiated constitutional amendment shall be signed by registered electors who reside in each state senate district in Colorado in amount equal to at least two percent of the total registered electors in the senate district...the number and boundaries of the senate districts and the number of registered electors in the senate districts shall be those in effect at the time the form of the petition has been approved for circulation as provided by law.”
