Thank you for the information on the upcoming Colorado Charitable Solicitations Rules meeting. I'm responsible for solicitation registration management in all 50 states on behalf of the University of Denver. The registration requirement is an effective tool for protecting the public from fraudulent solicitors, providing information to the public on those soliciting in the state of Colorado as well as to hold solicitors accountable to the state and the public. My thoughts relative to current Colorado requirements and new requirements follow:

- 1. Perhaps Colorado could be the leader in streamlining requirements for all 50 states
- 2. Consider allowing the filed 990 satisfy 99% of the reporting requirement....along with an updated profile to keep abreast of any changes in address, name changes, board members etc.
- 3. Consider requiring a "registered agent" only for those entities that lie outside of Colorado any bonafide Colorado business should have a bonafide address which can be used in the event of "serving notices".
- 4. Consider an automatic extension for any entity filing the 990 most businesses who end their year on 6/30 requires the extension for the 990
