What if there was a restricted age for kids or no kids allowed in the hall at the time of the session of play. There are other states that say if you have to be 18 to be allowed in the hall and to play AND you must show ID. Right now it's just up to each hall and many don't enforce it. It's very distracting to the other players; many won't come if kids are permitted. As a caller, I can't enforce this as easily. I let the manager know and if they are lazy they won't do anything about it. The hall manager won't always do anything.

If the minimum age seems too high to enforce, what about 14 (high school) they will then be getting their ID from schools so they can show it to get into the hall. Most at that age will be better behaved rather than running around, spinning in their chair, playing in the bathroom, peeking in the other bathroom, annoying the other players, playing under the tables. Believe me I've seen most all they can do.
