**Subject:** Comments-Draft Election Rules concerning Voting Systems Conditions for Use

## Secretary Gessler,

Prowers County is a user of Hart InterCivic election equipment, so please understand that proposed Draft Election Rules for the Voting Systems Conditions for Use comes at a time of concern for smaller counties and the unaffordable impact it would impose.

## For example:

Page 1 20.3.1(e) The County must provide each DRE voter a Headset with an Adjustable volume Control. This would involve the purchase of additional eSlates to include headset to meet the requirements. We cannot simply just attach headsets to existing eSlates, therefore we would have a cost to purchase new eSlates to accommodate the rule. I am pretty sure the cost have increased since we last purchased eSlates back in 2006.

Page 3 (E) The voting system provider may not have an administrative or application 8 user/operator account, or administrative account access to the accounts. OR 9 USER ACCESS TO THE ELECTION MANAGEMENT SYSTEM OR ELECTION 10 DATABASE. IF A VENDOR PROGRAMS THE ELECTION, THE COUNTY MUST 11 CHANGE THE ADMINISTRATOR, USER, AND DEVICE-LEVEL PASSWORDS 12 BEFORE CONDUCTING THE LOGIC AND ACCURACY TEST. This would require some of us Hart Users to purchase BOSS at the cost of approximately \$25,000 and Prowers County would be one of them. That would be a huge impact to our county. Our Vendor (Hart) do programming for us since we didn't/don't' have the funds to purchase BOSS or Ballot Now Systems. I would rather have a trained ballot programmer to program our ballots. Since the vendor is never in our office I don't understand the need to change passwords prior to Logic and Accuracy testing. If the State is working on a process to move toward unified election equipment this seems unreasonable to standardize these rules for use at this time.

I always have concerns associated with elections and the ever changing rules... but at this time I am very busy with Mail Ballots so I haven't thoroughly read all 60 pages. I think that working with counties for a cost-effective solution is the best solution for our citizens/voters. I also thank you for the opportunity to comment.
