Dear Secretary Gessler and Assistant Dana Williams,

I am a voter in Jefferson County, a member of the republican party and an election judge. I am concerned about the lack of rules regarding media watcher behavior. It currently appears any limits placed upon the media watchers (as opposed to just "watchers"), or media observers, are dependent solely upon the individual counties and municipalities, to set. I request you make it explicit the new rules 8.6.8, 8.6.9 and 8.6.10, as well as rules 8.6.1 through 8.6.6 apply to media watchers as well as watchers (exclude rule 8.6.7), and that they must take the oath described in rule 8.1.

Recently, media watcher Marilyn Marks admitted in her West Metro Fire lawsuit cross examination (July 10th, around 3:00pm, just before afternoon break) she determined how some individuals, voted, had video evidence to prove it and did not, at any point, take an oath. This is unacceptable to voters like me, so it's clear some consistent rules must be applied to media watchers as well as watchers.
