**Subject:** Notarizing out-of-state petition circulators

## Hello,

I wonder if the rules could be clarified regarding notarizing out-of-state circulators for ballot initiatives. The 10th Circuit Court has ruled that as long as a circulator has a valid id, the petition can be notarized.

The wording on the Colorado SOS website implies that the circulator has to have a Colorado ID, which feels like fraud if

they are actually residents of another state, but just got the Colorado ID so they could circulate a petition. When you call the SOS's office you are told to write State ID on the document description on the petition's notary page when you encounter that circumstance with an out-of-state circulator with a valid out-of-state driver license or id. I just think that

this issue needs to be addressed in light of recent court rulings.
