Thank you for sending me the rule-making for voters, etc.

In the rules, I do not see anything particular that I have a problem with...but I would like to register a comment about voter fraud, etc before the October 6th deadline your office has...

A concern of mine is this:

I know Trump said that there are fraudulent votes being made....though I do not usually agree with Trump, I do agree this may be the case.

In our particular instance, with our father's death, we hired a Personal Representative by the name of [REDACTED]. [REDACTED] committed many minor atrocities in dealing with our Dad's death...which I won't go into here, and we have already taken him to court for some of the major "bad" things he did.

But the major reason that I am bringing up in this email is because, as the Personal Representative for our Father's estate, he was supposed to register the death certificate with agencies such as yours. We recently noticed that our Dad, [REDACTED], who died at the age of 90 on April 26th 2014 is showing up as being a current mail-in voter at the age of 93. This is totally bogus, and it makes me wonder how many other dead people are still on the voting rolls because of dishonest and negligent Personal Representatives such as [REDACTED].

[REDACTED] is also a court-appointed Public Administrator for [REDACTED], so I am afraid his bad/criminal habits might have extended to that county as well.

In some form or another, I would like to make a comment that allowing dead people to vote by not properly carrying out the professional duties of a Personal Representative should hold its own liabilities.
