Suggestion: I am writing to suggest the Secretary of State create and make available for Colorado Notaries Public a digital notary stamp for RONS (remote online notarizations) to download and use on the various platforms approved by the CO SOS. Upon researching the issue, many of the approved website platforms listed on the SOS website do not accept CO notaries and some do not intend to in the future. Furthermore, the National Notary Association sells a PNG notary seal, however, it does not work on the DocVerify platform which is one of the only platforms available to Colorado Notaries at this time. I have set up my DocVerify account for eNotary and Remote Notary on the DocVerify platform, however, notaries here must purchase the seal from them at a cost of \$100 and is good for 5 years, this is in addition to the \$125 set up fee and \$75 per month enterprise account necessary to use the platform, however, the seal is not usable on other platforms, greatly increasing the cost of having a digital stamp.
